## 2. About Collective Moves labs

Between 2021 and 2023 we will run five x 5 month Collective Moves labs online and face-to-face to co-create a site-specific *Libertalia* performance in each lab's host city.

- 1) Bot lab in Bootle: Mar-Jul 21 will co-create Libertalia: Born by the River: the last Pirate
- 2) Got lab in Gothenburg: May to Aug 21 will co-create Libertalia
- 3) Turk lab in Turku: Feb to Jun 22 will co-create Libertalia: Cultural Treasures
- 4) Bis lab in Bad Ischl will co-create Libertalia: Salt Pirates
- 5) Vez lab in Veszprém : Feb to Jun 23 will co-create Libertalia : Forest Pirates

Each lab brings together 18 creative practitioners from over 7 European countries. You will be supported through a series of co-creation exercises online and then face-to-face to co-create a new adapted 'Libertalia' performance for public presentation. The lab's co-creation process and performances are inspired by the mythical pirate 'Libertalia' utopia that 17<sup>th</sup> & 18<sup>th</sup> century Gathenhielm/European pirates were said to have founded on the principles of connection, compassion and self-governance.

This project is made possible by an international partnership led by SAFE, with Historieverket, City of Turku, Salzkammergut 2024; Veszprém-Balaton 2023; Limerick City and County Council; Magdeburg 2025 European Capital of Culture Candidate City.

Libertalia' is co-created by Collective Moves in association with Fidget Feet Aerial Dance and String Theory Harp with Autoportante and Panjal.

## 2.1 Lab curriculum



Each lab will see 18 creative practitioners from Bootle, Gothenburg, Bad Ischl, Turku, Veszprém, Magdeburg and Limerick come together to co-create a 'Libertalia' performance for local audiences to enjoy live and online.


The labs are delivered online and face to face by the Collective Moves ensemble (see section 5 below).

Lab 1-3 will be online, participants will connect on zoom and a groups.io forum. Each is held over 3 days with introduction and task setting sessions followed by self-directed or sub-group explorations offline which are then shared back to the group.

Lab 5 is a week-long face-to-face lab where you will work with your fellow participants, alongside 15 community or young people participants and the Collective Moves ensemble to co-create the performance for 'work in progress' public presentation.

Lab 5 is a debrief and feedback session online.

## 2.2 Libertalia performance



Each 'Libertalia' performance will be an outdoor site specific 'alternative' aerial opera. Each city will have its own performance that tells of its pirates. We will deliver this as two performances.

The first performance, *Libertalia*, will kick off the event and set the scene for the pirate world of Libertalia to open its doors to each cities pirate story.

- Bot lab will perform Born by the River: the last pirate in Bootle;
- Got lab will perform an extended Libertalia in Gothenburg;
- Tuk lab will perform Cultural Treasures in Turku,
- Bis lab will perform Salt Pirates in Bad Ischl and
- Vez lab will perform Forest Pirates in Veszprém.

Each performance will integrate aerial dance, tight rope, pirate sign language, clowning and physical theatre with live & recorded music. You will trained in aspects of these disciplines by the Collective Moves ensemble where needed. But you will also be co-creators lending your own art form to the performance. Frameworks are in place for Libertalia performances to ease the pressure of delivery. But they are still very much work in progress, with space for your creative input.

The performance will have a basic outdoor set with a vertical 11 meter aerial rig designed to look like a ships mast with an integrated harp-piano instrument. The horizontal satellite stages and tightrope will give the impression of a pirate ship. There is space to co-create props and costumes for your production.

### **4.2 Collective Moves : Libertalia performance programme**

Each lab will result in a live performance. The performances are all listed below:

## **Bot lab (Bootle)**

**Born by the River: the last pirate:** Tells the story of Aggie, the daughter of a merchant seaman who's wanderlust makes her determined to sail the world and seek adventure against her father's wishes. They say the seas are no place for a girl — as the wind blow her into the company of a group of pirates.

## Got lab (Gothenburg)

**Libertalia**: Tells the story of 4 pirates, Capitani, Johnny Norway, Pi & Krilo, who set sail to find and found Libertalia. Journeying through storm and ship wreck, only to realise the treasure of Libertalia can only be got through journeying into their inner worlds and facing their biggest fears. Our pirates get help from an unexpected source when they meet their inner world counter parts. 4 pirates become 8 as they battle to find the treasure and break out into a new super real world of Libertalia.

## Tuk lab (Turku)

**Cultural Treasures :** The performance will explore the vision of 'Recreation Division' through the theme 'Good life in Turku'. The theme of 'Culture does Good' has been a main focus since the European Capital of Culture year in 2011.

### Bis lab (Bad Ischl)

**Salt Pirates**: The Salzkammergut people cherish liberty above all and have always resisted being ruled. Their history include the stories of Nazi resistance and before this under the Habsburg monarchy this region was a royal enclave with Salt — "the white gold" — bringing huge wealth for the rich, whilst the salt miners lived in poverty. The performance is based on Salzkammergut people's rebellious, stubborn and quirky nature that gave them a culture in which those who smuggled and poached became regional heroes — their Robin Hoods. Crucially a small but strong "heathen" community (amongst the Christian majority) acted as Salt Pirates— stealing the salt from the passing boats and providing for the poor.

## Vez lab (Veszprem)

**Forest Pirates:** The performance will tell the story of Veszprém's Woodland pirates, the out-laws of the surrounding Bakony-hills. Drawing a parallel with their Haszkovó habitants, who learnt to appreciate their isolation. Much like the Libertalia-pirates, isolation became a pledge to freedom. But also a price of it.
