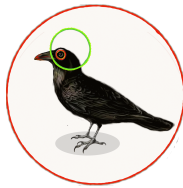

Playing with serious disease

The work takes its starting point from Joel Heirá's need to deal with Parkinson's disease as performative language. By getting to know the expressions of the disease and examining their communicative possibilities, a playful, creative attitude towards serious illness is adopted. The question that is asked is how Parkinson's disease as a movement-based and rhythmic phenomenon can be poeticized through movement-based performing arts and music. The title, Amor Fati, is drawn from Friedrich Nietzsche's conceptualization, and takes note of his call to affirm and embrace even life's difficulties.

A sound world of birds, an image. A discovery of this world.

A body that shakes. How does a shaking hand become a living bird?

How does the body become a communicative event? When am I in charge? When do I follow?

Form and flow, simplicity and attention to the present, without pretense

In a certain sense, the work is a ritual that aims to 1.) Create meaning with the disease; 2.) Through scenic action sublimate emotions; 3.) turn symptoms into poetic narrative beyond the personal; 4.) create context and new reality.

Based on the symptoms of the disease, a world is created to explore, a theme to gather around. Joel invites others to participate in the work's scenic atmosphere and environment, to meet in intertwining with the world of the project, in co-creation. The work is framed by a composed soundscape of birdsong and music, the improvisational flow of the musicians creates a groove in interaction with the scenic actions; movement/dance, words, song. The expression moves freely between concrete and abstract, where the meaning does not obey the logic of reason. It is a dreamlike aesthetic through which we create a gap between action and intelligibility - in communication - that opens up for the viewer's imagination to interact and interpret.



On March 18 this year, we carried out such a collaboration, at Cinnober Theatre in Gothenburg, which resulted in a performance that was a mixture of the scenic structure of Amor Fati and a semi-improvised dream play in the borderland between dance, musical, poetry, clown, mime, freeform jazz, sound art and physical theatre. We plan to gather the same participants again and do another collaborative intervention. In that case, we enter a week process leading up to the premiere and a total of 4 performances. For this we are seeking funds from the state, municipality and private donors.

During the fall of '23, Joel will work with senior deviser Michael Norlind for 20 days at the Performative Arts centre of Gerlesborg to develop, nuance and deepen the foundation he laid.

THE ARTISTS

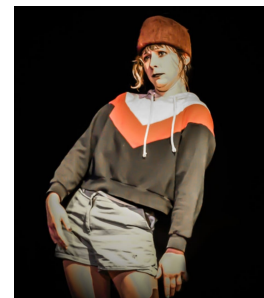
Joel Heirås is a Gothenburg-based improviser, physical performer and musician. In my stage practice, I work in the borderland between theatre, dance, music and poetry. He enjoys when the combination of these elements puts me in a state of intense communication with others - fellow players and audience. The body - his instrument - is the register with which he has the opportunity to express himself, and it works best when he relates to this instrument like the puppeteer to his puppet. Only then does the story - the image - come to the fore and the fictional takes on the effect of reality. Therefore, his art is about creating reality with the body. www.joelheiras.se

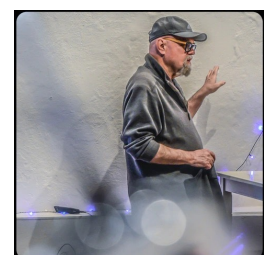
